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BIRMINGHAM, MICHIGAN More than halfway across the country, the master bath in one of six town homes in a condo cluster features a tub and shower angled in windowed corners. Windows here offer views of a bubbling stream and waterfall. "When needed, privacy blinds descend from recesses in the ceiling by pushing a button," says the interior designer, Birmingham-based Jeffrey King. Add cabinetry



designer Janice Morse, of Designs Unlimited in nearby West Bloomfield. "The concept was to be neutral and not compete with the view." Honoring the owners' wishes, King and Morse placed the toilet in a separate room, but included a floor-to-ceiling linen closet at the far end of that space. Essential storage is supplied by nine drawers in the double vanity; tall niches cut into one shower wall hold soaps and shampoos.

A CLASSIC IN SHOWER and corner tub, opposite, consume the far end of this 10x14-foot bath. The floor, shower walls, and tub deck are all faced with porcelain tile. Porcelain sinks are dropped into a pale granite countertop, this page. The 3-foot-long vanity is stained chestnut, as are the frames of the mirrors behind it.
